A review and discussion of the April 05, regular meeting agenda items took place.

Meeting was called to order at 6:00

1. Mayor Hanby announced the kitchen cabinets have been re-installed in Anchor. The only item still needing attention, is painting kitchen area damaged by water leak. Hopefully this can be accomplished by volunteers.
2. Grant options were briefly discussed.
3. Cleanup day was discussed and tentatively set for Saturday, April 23rd, the Saturday, following Easter weekend. There was a brief discussion regarding bobcat equipment needed to load and transport mulch for playground area.
4. Completion of boat landing at Anchor was discussed and Tim Moore stated that excessive rain is causing the delay. He stated that it will be completed as soon as enough consecutive days with no rain, allow him to finish the project. It is too wet for working with concrete.
5. Mayor Hanby discussed ongoing library project of "Caterpillars to Butterflies" being on display in our library. Butterflies will hopefully be released mid-April at the park. Also discussed, was a wetland area at the park with butterfly attracting plantings and blueberry bushes.
6. Dock addition for Josh Beck was tabled until next meeting, due to length of dock. Tim will review plans of dock positioning.
7. Mayor Hanby opened discussion regarding a possible resolution, allowing for a half-year non-residential fishing permit for those applying after year-end. Further discussion in regular meeting.
8. Sid Nelson opened discussion of resolution to credit \$100.00 to non-residents for lack of fishing accessibility during 2021. This would apply only to those who purchased a current license in 2021 and renew in 2022. Sid Nelson also suggested that 2022 non-resident fishing pricing be lowered, possibly to \$450.00 from current \$500.00.
